The number 525,600 is a HUGE number. For some people it may even be too large to fathom. For others, you know exactly what this number represents...it represents the minutes in a year.

As they sing in the song, "Seasons of Love" from Rent: 525,600 minutes, 525,000 moments so dear, 525,600 minutes…how do you measure a year?

So, how do we measure this past year? This has surely been a year unlike any of us have ever experienced. As a Temple family we could measure this year in B'nai Mitzvah, in weddings, in births and yes - in deaths.

We could also measure our year in Zoom programs, holiday gift bags, coats collected, and cans of food donated.

At the beginning of March 2020, I don't think any of us could have predicted where we'd be a year later. **We have all experienced some type of loss this year.** As a Temple community, we have collectively experienced the greatest type of loss due to death—both directly and indirectly affected by Covid-19. Some of us loss loved ones to this virus and others weren't able to properly mourn loved ones because of the restrictions this virus has caused.


Although others of us experienced loss in comparatively small ways, this has still had a big impact. Loss has come in the way of cancelled vacations, missed graduations, and time spent without being together with loved ones.

Finally, a year later, we can see the light at the end of the tunnel. However, we are still in the tunnel. While many of our congregants have been blessed to receive the vaccine, many others won't even be eligible for months. Therefore, now, just as we've done all along, we must support one another and continue to show each other respect and love. As the song states, we can measure our year in LOVE. In addition to measuring this past year in loss, I hope we can also measure the year in love- ways we have loved ourselves and ways we have loved one another.

While we continue to move through this challenging time, let us strive to continue to offer love. Let this be our measurement, and as is said in the book of Psalms "let us turn our mourning into dancing." And now, let us turn our loss into love.



February was a great month for Tikkun Olam. Thanks to the continued generosity of our congregants, the Tikkun Olam committee was able to donate over \$300 to the North Carolina Food Bank and, together, we, with the Rabbi, made a \$180 donation to <u>One Soil Farm</u>.

As we look to improve Temple of Israel's Tikkun Olam impact in our community, the ToC is going to introduce an additional way to get involved in Tikkun Olam. We will continue to focus on one "big action" and one Mitzvah Hour per month. In addition to this, we are going to start a "Showcase a Cause" effort each month, dedicating one Shabbat Service sermon and a portion of each month's bulletin to raise awareness of different causes happening here in Wilmington. Do you know what a <u>food desert</u> is? Did you know the Reibman Center is located in a food desert, called the Northside Food Desert? Did you know there is a not-for-profit organization that is focused on ending this food desert? This month's ToC "Showcase a Cause" is the <u>Northside Food Co-op</u>. The Northside Food Co-op is a community-owned cooperative grocery store planned for the Northside of downtown Wilmington that will ensure food security and end the food desert, generate resilience in our neighborhoods, and enhance the local economy through equity and ownership. They are starting a pilot grocery store this year named Frankies. If you are interested in learning more about the Northside Food Co-Op or Frankies, then we invite you to review this presentation.
