

Another Thanksgivukkah??? By Rabbi Emily Losben-Ostrov

This year Hanukkah begins on the 25th of Kislev. Oh, wait, *EVERY year the holiday* of Hanukkah begins on the 25th of Kislev. However, this year the 25th of Kislev happens to fall on Sunday, November 28th which is the end of "Thanksgiving Weekend." So, while we don't have an official "Thanksgivukkah" like we did in 2013, we do have somewhat of a confluence of our American holiday for gratitude and our Jewish holiday for miracles.

In many ways the holiday of Thanksgiving can be seen as a Jewish holiday in that it celebrates a few of the core tenets of Judaism. Much of our faith is based on the idea of showing gratitude both to God and to one another. In fact, simply praising God, as we do in most our prayers, can be seen as an act of thanksgiving- an act of showing gratitude to the Divine. Whether we are thanking God for food (*motzi, kiddush*) or praising God for commanding us to preform a mitzvah (*lighting candles*), our prayers are an opportunity to pause and give both praise and gratitude. Other commandments such as honoring your mother and father is a way that our faith directly links us to the act of thanksgiving by way of *kavod* (honor).

At the root of the history of the "first Thanksgiving" there is the group of Pilgrims- a group of people who came to this land for freedom to worship as they choose. Not only is freedom of worship central to us Jews as a religious minority, but it is also the core of what it means to be a Reform Jew. Our denomination is one in which we take great pride in "educated choice through knowledge." Those Pilgrims had great faith to leave their life behind so they could practice their faith freely. We Jews truly understood that ideal and the entire holiday of Hanukkah is about our fight to live and practice as Jews.

Another reason why Thanksgiving can be seen as "Jewish" at the core is the foundation of the celebration being an opportunity for different people to come together in praise. When we celebrate Thanksgiving we often think about sitting at a table with our families, but the original Thanksgiving is based on two very different groups coming together. Shouldn't this be a model for us, that despite our differences among families, among congregants, and among different cultures we can still find a way to come together?

As we celebrate Thanksgiving and then Hanukkah- let both of these holidays remind us to always show gratitude despite our challenges and differences for it can lead us to miracles!



One hundred and fifty years ago (150) years ago, on November 9, 1871, the congregation Temple of Israel was organized at the home of Abram Weill. He lived on the corner of 4th and Orange Streets. The men on the organizing committee all lived within walking distance. They were all natives of Germany except Nathanial Jacobi who grew up in Charleston. Abram Weill was also the chairman of the building committee when the funds were

raised to build the Temple. His descendants, that I know, live in Greensboro, North Carolina and Baltimore, Maryland. The have been very helpful in giving me photographs and information on Temple history. The 150 Restoration campaign is named for our sesquicentennial as an organization.




