Trapped in Translation with Rabbi Seth M. Limmer Wednesday, Jan 11th at 7:30pm


What is this trap of translation? One example can be found in exploring the distance between the Christian concept of "Conversion" (being one thing and transforming to another) and the Hebrew concept of Ger (literally, "being a person on a journey").

Analyzing a series of key cultural differences, in language and practice, between Judaism and Christian culture, this session will help us understand Judaism for its essential self, rid of the limitations of "religious" language. The goal is to allow us to free ourselves from our own trap of translation, and, whether Jewish or not, discover the keys that will help us unlock the doors to a more authentic identity.


